ABSENCE AND ILLNESS

FILM WORKSHOP

In May Alasdair Satchel came in to lead a film workshop session with the children. Alasdair helped the children think of ways to describe their favourite films in just a few words (without using the title) to see if others could guess the film they were describing. This helped them to think about the important features that make up a film - like the characters, the storyline, and music.

The children then listened to a sound clip from a film and worked together, using their imaginations, to describe what was happening. They then watched the clip to see how it compared with the images they had imagined.

Next the children created their own film using their own chosen props.
