OUTDOOR LEARNING WITH **ARDROY**

Report by Gemma - When we arrived at school on 22nd March, we were greeted by a cheery chap named Alex sheltering beneath a green tarpaulin tent in the playground! "What do you call something that is brown and sticky?" he joked. 'Mud?' asked someone. "Nope, a brown stick!" came the punchline! He was our leader for a morning of outdoor education fun in our school grounds, which began with orienteering. Using the map of the world painted on the playground, we warmed up with a game to teach us about the points on a compass, racing between North, South, East and West! Working in teams, we then produced a map of our school grounds on a whiteboard, with a key showing all of the main areas.

After a short snack break, where Alex played a game of catch the pig (a bit like 'What's the Time, Mr Wolf?'), everyone was raring to go again! Putting their new orienteering skills into practice, the children headed off on a treasure hunt to find the hidden markers around the school grounds. Then it was on to fire building - the children learned which natural materials to collect to build a wee fire (mostly dry twigs, sticks and bark) foraged from around the garden and, using a flint, the P6 and P7 students created sparks to get the fire going. Once it was burning strong, we toasted marshmallows as a treat. Thank you Alex for sharing your knowledge and skills with the children. They all enjoyed it very much and have been busy working on Thank You cards to share what they learned and enjoyed the most.

Here is what some of the children had to say:

"I enjoyed learning how to make the fire and finding out about the different resources that you can use. I learned which resources are good for making a fire and what each different symbol means on a map. I would like to learn more about maps and use some in unfamiliar places. I would also like to learn more about countries. Thank you for coming and teaching us about the outdoors; it was very fun doing all the activities." Lucy.

"I enjoyed marshmallows and I learned how to play a new game. Thank you." Tyler.

"I learned that birch bark has good oil in it and it can be used in fire." Lucille.

"I enjoyed the marshmallows. I learned how to go North, South, East and West." Caitlyn.

"I enjoyed the treasure hunt we did! I learned how to use flint and steel. I would like to learn more about different ways to make fire in the wilderness. Thank you for all the learning you did for us." Callum.

"I learned North, South, East and West. Thank you." Hannah.

"I enjoyed roasting a marshmallow and I learned to stay back away from fire." Isla.

"I enjoyed making fire and knowing what item to use. I learned what symbols on the map mean. I want to learn more about maps." Joseph.

"I enjoyed making fire. I learned about wildlife. Thank you." Mya.

"I enjoyed marshmallows and I learned about North, South, East and West." Leo.
