On the 5th September Andy Cannon, formerly of Wee Stories Theatre brought 'Is this a Dagger?' To Ulva Primary School for P4-P7. In this story of Macbeth, audiences joined Andy on a thousand-year journey from fact to fiction and back again.

The show was nominated for CATS Award for Best Show for Children and Young People and described as "Strikingly heartfelt and intelligent... immensely classy stuff" by The Scotsman.

They saw that Macbeth would be promoted to Thane of Cawdor and to be the 'King of an awfy lot of Scotland'. He became the king because he killed the guy who was king. I liked the play.
